2024 Scored Iowa Legislation

Bestiality (HF 2318/SF 2018)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HF 2318 or SF 2018, which update Iowa's bestiality code to include internet-based crimes, sales and distribution of bestiality pornographic material, and cases involving a minor.

Sponsors: Sen. Dan Dawson (R) and Rep. Bobby Kaufmann (R)

Status: Passed both chambers and was signed by the Governor on April 10th, 2024.

Veterinary Tech Capabilities (HF 670/SF 541)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HF 670 or SF 541, which permit licensed veterinarian technicians to perform more duties in order to increase access to pet patient care.

Sponsors: Sen. Dan Zumbach (R) and Rep. Michael Sexton (R)

Status: Passed both chambers and was signed by the Governor on June 1st, 2023.

Veterinarian Civil Immunity (HF 472)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HF 472, which would provide civil lawsuit protections for veterinarians who assist law enforcement with animal cruelty crime investigations.

Sponsor: Rep. Jane Bloomingdale (R)

Status: Passed the House. Did not receive a floor vote in the Senate.

Black Bear Hunting and Trapping (HF 175)

A ✓ indicates a vote against HF 175, which would list black bears as a fur-bearing species eligible for future hunting or trapping.

Sponsor: Rep. David Jacoby (D)

Status: Passed the House. Did not receive a floor vote in the Senate.

Breed-Specific Preemption (HF 651)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HF 651, which would prevent local governments from adopting or enforcing breed-specific legislation statewide.

Sponsors: Rep. Jacob Bossman (R) and Rep. Brian Lohse (R)

Status: Passed the House. Did not receive a floor vote in the Senate.

Humane Society Legislative Fund
